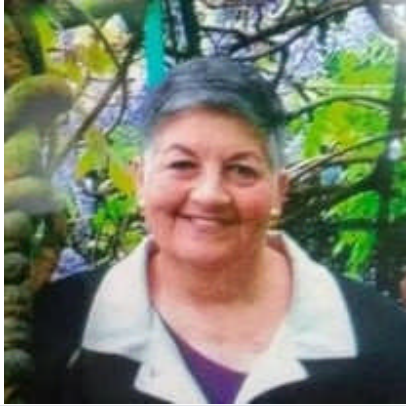


Nancy (Hopkins) Cook
